Notes from the Pastor

Today we celebrate the Twenty-Ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time.

During a ceremony this afternoon at Holy Name Cathedral, Mrs. Elaine Anclade will be honored with the *Christifideles* award. This recognition was established by Francis Cardinal George and is given to laypersons who demonstrate faithfulness and dedication in ministry. It was my honor to nominate Mrs. Anclade after consulting with and receiving the unanimous endorsement the members of the pastoral staff and the members of the Parish Pastoral Council. Previous recipients from Saint Mary Parish are: Melinda Henson, Michael Sarlitto, Geraldine Idstein, Karen Preston, Jane & Dan Sherlock, Lori Lalowski, and Ted Nowokunski.

On Tuesday October 19, Father Carneiro, Father Trout, and I - together with each priest who celebrates the Eucharist in the Archdiocese of Chicago - will be attending a day long program at the Drury Lane / Oak Brook centered on receiving the Third Edition of the Roman Missal. As you likely know, a new translation of the Mass in English will be implemented at the start of Advent 2011. Liturgical scholar, the Rev. J. Michael Joncas, the composer of *On Eagles Wings*, will facilitate this day. On Tuesday October 26, the members of our pastoral staff will attend a Vicariate Staff Day at Saint Mary of Vernon regarding the practical matters related to implementation of the Revised Roman Missal at the parish level. The next year will give us time to prepare for what might sound different, but more importantly to consider the importance of us praying well together. To learn more about the revised texts that we will use at Mass, visit www.usccb.org/romanmissal.

This Tuesday the Church also celebrates the Memorial of the North American Martyrs – French Jesuit and Oblate missionaries to the Hurons and Iroquois 1642-1649: Saint John de Brebeuf, Saint Isaac Jougues, and their martyred companions Antony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, Noel Chabanel, and Oblates Rene Goupil and Jean de la Lande. The seed of the Church on this continent was water by the blood of these martyred saints. We ask that they continue to intercede for us.

As the November 2 election approaches, we are reminded that, while the Church does NOT endorse particular candidates or parties, all those who are eligible are encouraged to vote - exercising Faithful Citizenship. With this in mind, the Catholic Conference of Illinois, with the approval of the Bishops of the state's six dioceses, conducted a survey of the candidates for Governor based on issues important to the CCI. Let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish. Father Reszel



TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Our first reading from Timothy focuses on the need to be persistent in preaching the Word of God. The Bible is the heart of our tradition and teaches us the great truths that we must remain faithful to even in difficult times.

The Gospel reading also focuses on persistence, but this time in prayer. The passage for today is a parable. Thus, the characters should not be taken as representatives of God and the faithful. The focus is not that we can twist the arm of an unwilling God, but simply that persistence in prayer puts us in touch with God and opens us to the ways of God. In this sense we receive the gifts of God. (*Treehaus Publications*)

Ask, seek, knock: you will receive. My God, I will always hope in you.

Discuss as a family: What does it feel like to be treated unfairly? What did you hear God say to you in the readings? Describe how you can try to follow God's word. How can you live out what is right and true? (Treehaus Publications)


